引言 Introduction

在全球化的背景下，移民的跨境流动日益成为国家间社会经济往来的主要形式。作为全球排名第四的移民来源国，中国大陆海外移民人数已经超过 954 万。随着改革开放深入以及“一带一路”政策推行，中国变身为最受外国人青睐的国家之一，正逐步成为亚洲举足轻重的国际移民接收国。如何通过跨境人口迁移与国际交往来促进世界与中国的联系，使中国融入世界，使世界认同中国，是中国学界、政策及实践部门必须面对的现实问题。

为此，值建国七十周年之际，浙江大学社会学系与洛杉矶加州大学（UCLA）亚太中心拟于 2019 年 9 月 4 日-6 日在浙江大学紫金港校区（中国·杭州）联合召开“国际移民：理论、政策与实证研究”国际学术研讨会，主要议题有：（1）国际移民治理；（2）国际移民理论及其进展；（3）外国来华群体的现状与问题；（4）国际移民政策的问题与挑战；（5）国际移民管理体制。会议语言为中英双语。

会议将不收取任何注册费用，主办方提供会议期间餐饮。与会者往返旅费及住宿费敬请自理。会议将对浙江大学的师生开放。

In the era of globalization, cross-border movements of people have increasingly become the main form of social and economic exchanges between countries. As the fourth largest source of international migration, the number of emigrants from mainland China to other parts of the world has exceeded 9.54 million. The deepening of economic reform and open-door policy and implementation of the “One Belt, One Road” initiative has also made China one of the most popular destination for foreigners, tourists, students, investors, entrepreneurs, and workers alike. How to promote the world’s connection with China through migration and exchange, integrate China into the world, and help the world understand China are some of the urgent issues that Chinese policy-makers, scholars, and practitioners face.

To this end, and on the occasion of the 70th anniversary of the founding of the People's Republic of China, the Department of Sociology of Zhejiang University and the Asia Pacific Center of University of California, Los Angeles (UCLA) are co-organizing and co-hosting an international symposium on “International Migration: Theory, Policy, and Empirical Research” on the Zijingang campus of Zhejiang University (ZJU), Hangzhou, China, on September 4-6, 2019. Main topics include: (1) Governance issues on international immigration; (2) International immigration theories and theoretical advancement; (3) Current status and issues of foreign groups in China; (4) Issues and challenges in international immigration policy-making; (5) International immigration management systems. Language use in the symposium is English and Chinese.

There will be no registration fees. Meals and refreshments during the symposium will be provided. Participants will be responsible for all travel and accommodation expenses. The symposium is open to ZJU faculty and students.

C. Cindy Fan, Ph.D. Geography, is Vice Provost for International Studies and Global Engagement and Professor of Geography. She is the first woman and Asian to hold that position at UCLA, and she works closely with the UCLA Chancellor's Office to strengthen the university's relationships and partnerships with institutions all over the world. Prior to her Vice Provost appointment, Cindy Fan served as Associate Dean of Social Sciences, Chair of the East Asian Studies Interdepartmental Program, and Chair of the Asian American Studies Department. Professor Fan is internationally known for her research on migration, regional development and gender in China and has published numerous articles. Her book *China on the Move: Migration, the State, and the Household* is a pioneering study on rural-urban migration and split households in China.

Steven J. GOLD, Ph.D. Sociology, is Professor of Sociology at Michigan State University. Educated at Brandeis University, UC Santa Cruz and UC Berkeley, his interests include international migration, ethnic economies, ethnic community development, urban sociology, and qualitative field methods. He was the past president of the International Visual Sociology Association and past chair of the ASA Section on International Migration. Professor Gold is the author, co-author or co-editor of eight books, including *Refugee Communities: A Comparative Field Study* (Sage, 1992); *From The Workers' State to The Golden State* (Allyn and Bacon, 1995); *Immigration Research for a New Century: Multidisciplinary Perspectives* (with Rubén G. Rumbaut and Nancy Foner, Russell Sage Foundation, 2000); *Ethnic Economies* (with Ivan Light, Academic Press, 2000); *The Store in the Hood: A*

Century of Ethnic Business and Conflict (Roman and Littlefield, 2010); *The Routledge Handbook of International Migration Studies* (co-edited with Stephanie Nawyn, Routledge 2013); and *The Routledge Handbook of International Migration Studies*, Second Edition (co-edited with Stephanie Nawyn, Routledge, 2019). His book, *The Israeli Diaspora* (Routledge/University of Washington Press, 2002) won the Thomas and Znaniecki Award from the ASA Section on International Migration for the best book on international migration in 2003. Together with Rubén G. Rumbaut, Gold was the editor of *The New Americans* book series from LFB Academic Publishers which included over 100 volumes. He has published numerous articles about visual sociology. His photographs have appeared in many sociological monographs, journals and textbooks and are part of the permanent collections of the Los Angeles County Library and the Museum of Chinese in the Americas in New York City. The chair of 22 PhD dissertations and author of 100 journal articles and book chapters, Gold received the Charles Horton Cooley Award for Distinguished Scholarship in Sociology from the Michigan Sociology Association. 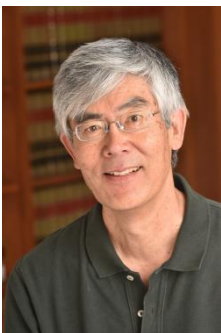
Douglas S. MASSEY

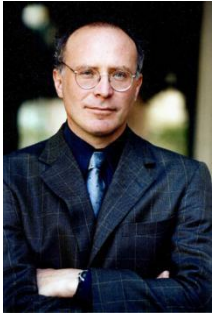
Hiroshi MOTOMURA



Hiroshi MOTOMURA is Professor of Law at UCLA. He is a teacher and scholar of immigration and citizenship, with influence across a range of academic disciplines and in federal, state, and local policymaking. His book, *Americans in Waiting: The Lost Story of Immigration and Citizenship in the United States* (Oxford 2006) won the Professional and Scholarly Publishing (PROSE) Award from the Association of American Publishers as the year's best book in Law and Legal Studies, and was chosen by the U.S. Department of State for its Suggested Reading List for Foreign Service Officers. He is a co-author of two immigration-related casebooks: *Immigration and Citizenship: Process and Policy* (8th ed. West 2016), and *Forced Migration: Law and Policy* (2d ed. West 2013), and he has published many widely cited articles on immigration and citizenship. His most recent book, *Immigration Outside the Law* (Oxford 2014), won the Association of American Publishers' Law and Legal Studies 2015 PROSE Award and was chosen by the Association of College and Research Libraries as a *Choice* Outstanding Academic Title. Professor Motomura has testified in the U.S. Congress, has served as co-counsel or a volunteer consultant in many litigated cases and policy matters, and has been a member of the American Bar Association's Commission on Immigration. He is one of the co-founders and current directors of the Rocky Mountain Immigrant

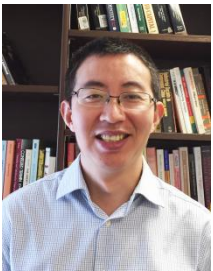
Roger WALDINGER



Roger WALDINGER, Ph.D. Sociology, is Distinguished Professor of Sociology and Director of the UCLA Center for the Study of International Migration. He works on international migration: its social, political, and economic consequences; the policies and politics emerging in response to its advent; the links between immigrants and the countries and people they have left behind; the trajectories of newcomers and their descendants after migration. He is the author of over 100 articles and book chapters and eight books, most recently, *A Century of Transnationalism: Immigrants and Their Homeland Connections* (edited with Nancy Green; University of Illinois Press, 2016) and *The Cross-Border Connection: Immigrants, Emigrants, and their*

Homelands (Harvard University Press, 2015). Professor Waldinger is currently Director of the UCLA Center for the Study of International Migration, an interdisciplinary, cross-campus center seeking to focus research and instruction on the causes and consequences of population movements across borders. He previously served as Interim Associate Vice-Provost for International Studies, 2010-2012; Chair of the Department of Sociology from 1999-2004; and Director of the Lewis Center for Regional Policy Studies, UCLA School of Public Affairs from 1995-1998. He was a 2008 Guggenheim Fellow. He received the 2012 Distinguished Career Award from the International Migration Section of the American Sociological Association and, with Thomas Soehl, the 2013 Reuben Hill Award (best research article) of the National Council on Family Relations. Shaohua Zhan received his doctoral degree in sociology from Johns Hopkins University and is assistant professor of sociology at Nanyang Technological University in Singapore. He was a recipient of the Henry Luce/ACLS postdoctoral fellowship in China Studies in 2014. Previously he also worked at the Chinese Academy of Social Sciences and the State University of New York at Binghamton. His research interests include land politics, food security, migration, and economic development. His articles have appeared in a number of top-ranked journals. He is the author of *The Land Question in China: Agrarian Capitalism, Industrious Revolution, and East Asian Development* (Routledge, 2019). He is currently working on two research projects. One project compares Chinese and Indian Immigrants in Singapore, Los Angeles and Vancouver. The other project examines food politics in China and its interconnections with international food trade, overseas agricultural investments, and global food security.

Min ZHOU, Ph.D. Sociology, is Professor of Sociology and Asian American Studies, the Walter and Shirley Wang Endowed Chair in US-China Relations and Communications, and Director of the Asia Pacific Center at the University of California, Los Angeles (UCLA). She is also a visiting professor of sociology in Zhejiang University. She was the Tan Lark Sye Chair Professor, Head of the Division of Sociology, and Director of the Chinese Heritage Centre at Nanyang Technological University, Singapore. She was also the Chang Jiang Scholar Chair Professor of Sociology at Sun Yat-sen University, China. Professor Zhou's main research areas are in migration and development, Chinese diaspora, education and the new second generation, ethnic entrepreneurship, ethnic/racial relations, and the sociology of Asia and Asian America. She has published widely in these areas, including an award-winning book *The Asian American Achievement Paradox* (2015), *The Rise of the New Second Generation* (2016), and *Contemporary Chinese Diasporas* (2017). She is the recipient of the 2017 Distinguished Career Award of the American Sociological Association Section on International Migration.

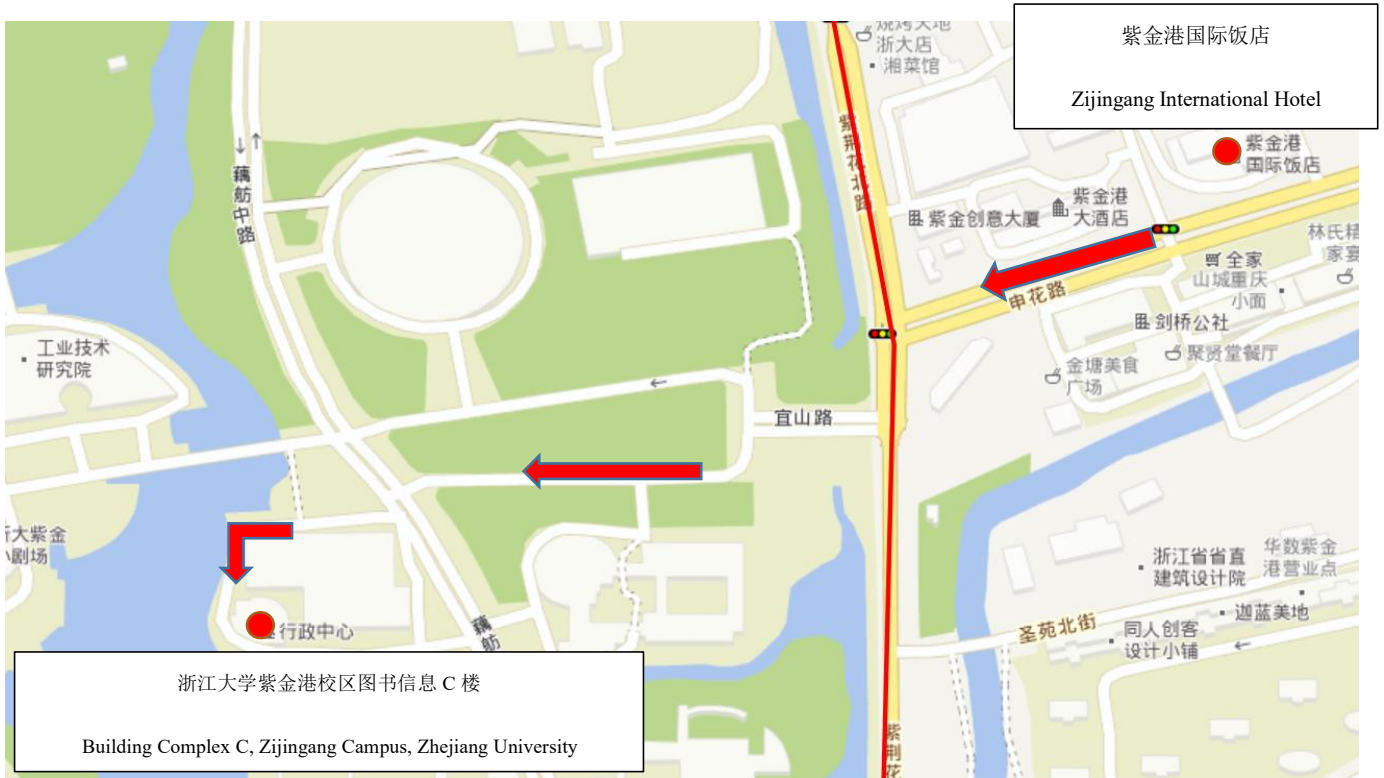
